WEST OF ENGLAND COMBINED AUTHORITY MAYORAL ELECTION

On Thursday, 6 May 2021 electors in Bath & North East Somerset, Bristol and South Gloucestershire, will have the opportunity to vote for the person they want to be the next West of England Mayor.

The Regional Mayor leads the West of England Combined Authority (WECA) and its work on the development of business, skills, housing and transport across the region.

The Combined Authority also leads on the region's recovery plan to make sure the right support and infrastructure is in place for residents and businesses to drive the West of England's recovery.

THE MAYORAL CANDIDATES

There are four candidates standing as Mayor for the West of England Combined Authority.

Candidates are listed in alphabetical order below. This is the order in which they will appear on the ballot paper.

NORRIS, Dan

Labour Party

THOMAS, Jerome Green Party

WILLIAMS, Samuel Patrick Sutherland The Conservative Party Candidate

WILLIAMS, Stephen Roy Liberal Democrat



VOTING INFORMATION

Every registered eligible elector will be sent a poll card explaining when, where and how to vote. For details of your polling station you can also contact your local council:



HOW TO CAST YOUR VOTE

There are three ways to vote:

In person – at the polling station on your poll card. Polling stations will have safety precautions in place in line with the latest Covid-19 guidance.

By post – you can apply for a postal vote on your local council website.

By proxy – where someone can vote on your behalf either at a polling station or by post. You can find out more on your local council website.

THE VOTING SYSTEM

This election uses the supplementary voting system.

You will have two votes – one for your first choice candidate and one for your second choice candidate.

The ballot paper will list all the candidates standing.

Next to the list of candidates there will be two columns.

- Vote by putting an X in column A, next to the name of the candidate who is your first choice. You must vote in this column for your first choice to be counted.
- Vote by putting an X in column
 B, next to the name of the candidate who is your second choice. If you do not vote in this column, your first choice vote will still be counted.
- If you vote twice for the same candidate, your second vote will not be counted.



 You should not mark more than one X in the first choice column A, and you should not mark more than one X in the second choice column B.

WHO IS ELECTED?

All the first choice votes are counted, and if one candidate has received more than 50% of the votes they will be elected West of England Mayor.



Any **second choice votes** for the two remaining candidates are added to their first round totals. **The candidate with the most votes wins.** If no candidate has more than 50% of the vote:

The two candidates with the most first choice votes will remain in the election and all other candidates are eliminated.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What do the West of England Mayor and West of England Combined Authority do?

The Regional Mayor leads the West of England Combined Authority and works to improve the lives of the people who live, work and travel in the West of England. This involves bringing partners together to improve transport in the region, helping residents access new skills, training and job opportunities, supporting businesses to succeed and addressing the region's housing, planning and infrastructure needs.

How does the West of England Mayor work with local councils?

The West of England Mayor works together with the Bristol Mayor who is responsible for the area covered by Bristol City Council and the leaders of Bath & North East Somerset and South Gloucestershire councils to make decisions to benefit the wider region.

How much funding does the Combined Authority attract?

Financial benefits were part of a devolution deal agreed in 2017, bringing £900m of new investment funding into the region. Since then over £1.15bn of new funding has been secured for the West of England region because we have a combined authority.

Why has every voter in my household been sent a booklet?

The law says that every registered voter must be sent their own copy, so they get a chance to see who the candidates are.

Why do I have two votes for one Mayor?

The law states that mayoral elections must be done this way. It allows you to say who would be your second choice for Mayor if your first choice is not in the top two after the first round of counting, and if there is not an outright majority winner at that stage.

I have lost my poll card, can I get another one?

If you are on the electoral register, you don't need a poll card to vote. You can attend the polling station and staff there will help you. The poll card is just to inform you that there is an election and explain where your polling station is.

Is voting in person safe?

Polling stations will have safety precautions in place in line with the latest Covid-19 guidance. You can keep yourself and others safe by:

- wearing a face covering
- bringing your own pen or pencil
- cleaning your hands when entering and leaving the polling station
- keeping a safe distance

What happens if I fall ill with Covid-19 or need to self-isolate?

You should not attend the polling station if you have symptoms of Covid-19, or if you have been asked to self-isolate. If you are self-isolating or become unwell as a result of Covid-19 shortly before polling day, or on the day itself, you may be able to apply for an emergency proxy vote. The electoral registration team at your local council will tell you what you need to do to arrange this.

The order in which the candidate addresses appear in this booklet has been determined by the drawing of lots by the Combined Authority Returning Officer, in accordance with The Combined Authorities (Mayoral Elections) order 2017.






- **19 April:** Deadline for registering to vote (11:59pm)
