Introduction

On Thursday 5 May 2022, electors in Tower Hamlets will vote for the person they want to be the next Mayor of the borough and for the local councillor(s) to represent their area on Tower Hamlets Council.

I sincerely hope you will exercise your right to vote in this important election. Plans for the elections are already well underway and we are working hard to ensure that local people can cast their votes safely and securely on 5 May.

These elections will have the strongest processes in place in London to prevent fraud and some of the most robust in the country.

The Mayor of Tower Hamlets is an important position. The Mayor will represent the borough and lead the council for the next four years, making decisions about services which matter to local people, from community safety to supporting vulnerable adults and children, and from housing to parks and open spaces.

There are 7 candidates standing for Mayor.

When you cast your vote, you will see that they will be listed on the ballot paper alphabetically (please see a sample ballot paper overleaf). Under the Local Authorities (Mayoral Elections) Regulations 2007, this booklet is sent to every registered elector in our borough. It contains a short contribution from all candidates for Mayor who chose to be included and who sent me statements which comply with the legal requirements.

Lots were drawn to determine the order in which the candidates' pages appear in this booklet and the content of each section is the responsibility of the candidate. The views expressed cannot be attributed to the Returning Officer or Tower Hamlets Council.

How to cast your votes

Vote once **⋈** in column 1 for your first choice

Vote once **∑** in column 2 for your second choice

For the Mayoral election you have two votes. Vote once in column one for your first choice candidate and once in column two for your second choice candidate.

You do not have to cast a second choice vote, but you must cast a first choice vote or your ballot paper will not be counted.

If you vote for the same candidate twice, your second choice vote will not be counted.

Who can vote?

To vote in this election your name must be included in the Register of Electors for Tower Hamlets.

All registered British, Commonwealth, Republic of Ireland and European Union citizens will be entitled to vote.

You must be aged 18 years on, or before, 5 May 2022.

- vote for a Councillor they have different jobs
- The Mayor makes decisions for the whole of Tower Hamlets



Rebuild Tower Hamlets. Rebuild our Future.

Walk with me round the historic hamlets of our borough. Bethnal Green, Bow, Poplar, the Isle of Dogs, Limehouse, Stepney, Shadwell, Wapping, and Whitechapel – where our wonderful new Town Hall in the former Royal London Hospital, which I commissioned when I was previously mayor, will open later this year.

REOPENING OUR ROADS

End Labour's chaotic 'Liveable Streets' road closures and keep roads open to avoid public disruptions. I'll scrap the plant pots blocking fire engines' access and rebalance traffic away from rat-runs. I pledge not to bring in new plans without meaningful consultation with the public and businesses.



I'll build 1,000 social homes every year; and we need to insist social and private landlords deliver decent services in return for fair rents. I'll establish a Housing Emergency Task Force to drive through change, and consult residents immediately on bringing Tower Hamlets Homes back in house as a council-run service.

A GREEN REVOLUTION

The climate emergency hasn't gone away, and we need to green-up council services quickly. Our community will struggle with rising fuel bills: we need a drive on energy efficiency in homes and businesses across

Tower Hamlets. I'll create green jobs whilst cutting living costs. Make Council carbon neutral, our homes energy-efficient and plant more trees.

TACKLING CRIME & ASB

We have a right to feel safe in our homes and on our streets. I'll set a target of arresting "a dealer a day" and supporting people to come off and stay off drugs (which are the cause of so much crime and

nuisance). I'll fund community police on-the-beat to tackle crime and antisocial behaviour so you can live your life in a peaceful environment.

REDUCE COST OF LIVING

Freeze council tax for 4 years and fund the 10% of council tax rebates government will not pay. Stop squeezing people struggling to make ends meet in the pandemic. Explore extending free school meals from

primary to secondary schools. A school holiday food fund for those most in need.

4 EDUCATION & SOCIAL CARE

Prioritise learning in schools, further education and university entrance as our youngsters' route to successful careers. We should have the highest aspirations for our children, who are our future. I will put

our local community at the heart of social services, with a return to top-notch care for children and adults to pass inspections with flying colours.

6 PROTECT FRONTLINE SERVICES

Bring back council services that work for you: invest in bin collections and street cleaning and launch rapid response teams to respond to fly tipping and filth on our residential streets which are in a terrible

state. Protect all Idea Stores, libraries and leisure centres from cuts. Stand up for council workers' rights with an end to fire and hire.

8 MORE YOUTH PROVISIONS

Let's give our youngsters something productive to do once again, instead of hanging around on street corners. I'll rebuild the 40-odd youth clubs closed by Labour – a borough-wide network of centres which can

support young people with homework space, careers advice, gang prevention work, developing life skills – and a host of leisure activities.



How the votes for Mayor will be counted

The verification and count for the Mayoral election will take place on Friday 6 May 2022 at the East Wintergarden, Canary Wharf commencing at 8am.

If one candidate gets more than 50% of the validly cast first choice votes, he or she will be elected as Mayor of Tower Hamlets.

If no candidate gets more than 50% the validly cast first choice votes, the two candidates with the most first choice votes remain in the contest and all the other candidates drop out. Then, the validly cast second choice votes on the ballot papers of the candidates who dropped out of the contest are counted. Where there are votes for the two candidates remaining in the contest, they are added to the first choice votes these candidates already have.

Of the two candidates, the one with the most validly cast first choice and second choice votes combined will be declared the next Mayor of Tower Hamlets.

Following the official declaration by the Returning Officer, the result will be published on the council's website and displayed on the notice board at the Town Hall. Follow the council on social media for the results:

When will the polling stations be open?

Polling stations will be open from 7am-10pm on Thursday 5 May. The location of your polling station is printed on your poll card.

I have lost my poll card, can I get another one?

If you are on the register you don't need a poll card to vote. You can attend the polling station and staff there will help you.

Do I need to take ID to the polling station?

You do not need to show ID to vote. You will need to tell polling staff your full name and address. They will then mark your name in the register and give you your ballot papers.

Why has every voter in my house been sent a booklet?

The law requires every registered voter is sent their own copy so they can see who the candidates are.

Do the candidates contribute to the cost of the booklet?

The law allows for the Returning Officer to require a contribution from candidates towards the cost of printing the booklets. All candidates contributed the same amount – £500.

When will the votes be counted?

The verification and count of votes will commence at 8am on Friday 6 May and the results will be published on the council's website.

How do you know that people who are voting are legitimate?

The council has worked hard to ensure that the borough's electorate are correctly registered under Individual Electoral Register (IER) ensuring everyone's details have been verified before adding them to the register.

During the election process, the council also carry out additional checks on late applications to the register and all addresses with more than six people registered to vote.
